What's in the Keep Kids Fed Act?

Summer 2022 Operations

- Continuation of widespread non-congregate, parent pick-up, and meal service time waivers
- TDA given discretion to issue area eligibility waivers
- SFSP Reimbursement for SSO operators through the end of Summer 2022 operations.

What's in the Keep Kids Fed Act?

School Year 2022-2023 - through June 30, 2023

- NSLP Lunches receive extra 40 cents per meal. School Breakfasts receive extra 15 cents per meal. Reimbursement added to new rate adjusted for inflation.
- Schools operating CACFP will receive an extra 10 cents for every meal and snack. Reimbursement added to new rate adjusted for inflation.
- Supply chain disruption flexibilities.

What IS NOT in the Keep Kids Fed Act?

 Universal free meals – School districts must process applications.

Now available to all SSO/SFSP Operators - No longer needs to be tied to a COVID-19 Incident

- All CEs switching to non-congregate feeding MUST submit an opt-in form (located on COVID-19 Intake Forms page of SquareMeals)
- Any changes to meal service times or site type MUST be submitted in the TX-UNPS site application and approved prior to a change in operations

Now available to all SSO/SFSP Operators - No longer needs to be tied to a COVID-19 Incident

- A switch to Grab-n-Go can occur immediately, but CEs MUST submit the opt-in form located at: https://squaremeals.org/FandNResources/CoronavirusUpdatefo rContractingEntities/IntakeForms.aspx
- Available until end of Summer 2022 operations

If switching to meal bundling:

- All children served must have the same access to the same number and type of meals within a given week.
- Site applications must reflect the days meals are to be claimed and the complete timeframe of meal service per day.

If switching to meal bundling:

- CEs must clearly identify when the non-congregate meal service occurs each week in its outreach materials.
- Maintain documented procedures that detail meal distribution plans as well as methods to prevent duplicative meal service and service of more than the maximum number of allowable meals per day.

Offsite Monitoring

Available to all SFSP and SSO operators through end of Summer:

- No longer needs to be tied to a COVID-19 incident
- All CEs conducting offsite monitoring MUST submit an opt-in form (located on COVID-19 Intake Forms page of SquareMeals)
- Available until end of Summer 2022 operations.

Area Eligibility

- Case-by-case basis per an approved request documenting how the site targets populations in need.
- SFSP and SSO CEs must submit this form, even if approved in previous summers.

Traditional Summer Waivers

- First week site visit waived for experienced sponsors.
- Closed Enrolled sites in eligible areas do not need to have a roster of 50% free/reduced children
- Meal service times
- Non-SFAs and SFAs can serve OVS using the SFSP meal pattern.

COVID Response Waivers

- Non-congregate feeding
- Parent pick-up
- Meal Service Times
- OVS in Senior High Schools

COVID Response Waivers

- Waivers only approved on a case-by-case basis
 - Closure of school due specifically to a COVID-19 outbreak.
 - Mandated quarantine of an entire classroom/select population due to COVID-19 exposure
 - Nutrition staffing issues caused by a specific COVID-19 outbreak.

COVID Response Waivers

TDA is developing a request form.

 Waivers will apply to Special Milk Program and Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

Offsite Monitoring

Available to all NSLP operators through June 30, 2023:

- No longer needs to be tied to a COVID-19 incident
- All CEs conducting offsite monitoring MUST submit an optin form (opt-in form coming soon)

Supply Chain Disruptions

- Not a meal pattern waiver!
 - CEs should make every effort to plan for supply chain disruptions, including preparation of alternate menus and plans for component substitutions.

Supply Chain Disruptions

In the event of a supply chain disruption:

- Emergency procurement is an option.
- If no option for procurement or substitution exists, maintain all documentation for why the meal pattern could not be met.
- Resource available: <u>Monthly Record of Meal Pattern</u>
 <u>Deviations Due to Supply Chain Disruptions Form</u>
- Notify ESCs/TDA.

Local Wellness Policy (LWP) Triennial Assessment Extension

- Extended to June 30, 2023 (including for CEs that have used this extension in previous years).
- Deadline for second triennial assessment is June 30, 2026.
- SUBMIT NOW IF NEEDED!!

- SFAs operating NSLP in SY 2021-2022 must use SY 2021-2022 eligibility data.
- SSO operators that processed and conducted verification on applications school wide in SY 2021-2022 must use SY 2021-2022 eligibility data.

SSO operators that processed **any** applications in either SY 2021-2022 or SY 2020-2021 for P-EBT or other purposes but did not conduct schoolwide application processing in either of those two years:

 Option 1 - Use only data from the last year applications were processed in their entirety.

SSO operators that processed **any** applications in either SY 2021-2022 or SY 2020-2021 for P-EBT or other purposes but did not conduct schoolwide application processing in either of those two years:

- Option 2 Use last documented eligibility for each student, which may include applications processed in different years.
- SFAs using this option must use the student's most recent status and not choose an earlier year's status, even if that appears to be more beneficial to the student.

Paid Lunch Equity Exemptions

- CEs with a negative fund balance are exempt from raising paid meal prices in accordance with PLE requirements.
 - Must inform TDA via online form - <u>https://squaremeals.org/FandNResources/CoronavirusUpda</u> <u>teforContractingEntities/IntakeForms.aspx</u>
- CEs with a zero or positive fund balance are already exempt from raising paid meal prices
 - No notification required.

Paid Lunch Equity Exemptions

For those calculating PLE this year:

- SY 2022-2023 PLE Tool released and posted to SquareMeals on May 24
- CEs should use the price last charged students (for many CEs this will be SY 2019-20 prices)

Severe Need Breakfast and Lunch Eligibility

- CEs/sites with at three months of NSLP claims during SY 2020-2021 will have the data needed to qualify for SY 2022-2023 severe need.
 - Any CE meeting this criterion that did not operate NSLP in 21-22 will use 22-23 data to qualify for severe need in 23-24.

Severe Need Breakfast and Lunch Eligibility

- CEs that switched to SFSP or SSO in SY 20-21 prior to submitting three months' NSLP claims:
 - Use the total number of lunches claimed free or reducedprice under NSLP for the time the CE operated NSLP in SY 2019-2020; OR
 - Use the total number of lunches claimed free or reducedprice under NSLP during the first three months of SY 2022-2023.

Severe Need Breakfast and Lunch Eligibility

- CEs that operated NSLP in SY 21-22 but did NOT have adequate NSLP claims data in SY 2020-21:
 - Use the total number of lunches claimed free or reducedprice under NSLP in SY 2021-22.

- Reimbursement rates targeted for "mid-July" per USDA. Will include information about the KKFA additional reimbursement.
- Spanish versions of applications and household letters.
 - Still awaiting new Spanish version of the NDS
 - USDA says "coming soon" but no timeframe
