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Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

What is it?

Section 104(a) of the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 amended the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to provide an alternative to household eligibility applications for free and reduced-price meals in high poverty CEs or schools

- Nationwide availability to offer CEP to CEs operating the National School Lunch (NSLP) and/or School Breakfast Program (SBP) began in SY 2014-15.
- A CE may participate in CEP for some or all schools in the Contracting Entity (CE) depending on the eligibility of individual schools and financial considerations based on the anticipated level of Federal reimbursement and other non-Federal support that may be available to cover any meal costs in excess of the Federal reimbursement.



CEP Report – General Information

Why is this report required?

Federal Regulations

- Publication and Notification Requirements
- USDA Required Reporting

- → Annually, CEs must provide current year schoollevel eligibility data to TDA, unless exempt
- □ Annually, TDA must notify SFAs of their eligibility for CEP and provide procedures for election
- ☐ Annually, TDA must post eligible and potentially eligible sites on the SquareMeals website
- □ Annually, TDA must report statewide direct certification data to USDA
- □ Annually, TDA uses CEP data to determine Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Eligibility



CEP Report – General Information

Who must report and when is it due?

Required report for <u>all</u> School Food Authorities (SFAs) operating the National School Lunch Program and/or the School Breakfast Program. This includes CEs operating CEP, Provision 2 and standard counting and claiming sites.

RCCIs are exempt from reporting.

- ☐ Annually, between March 1 and March 20
- ☐ CEs must report eligibility and enrollment that is reflective of April 1
- ☐ The report is due in TX-UNPS annually by March 20



CEP Report - General Information

What must be reported?

Number of enrolled Identified Students (IS) per site

★ Enrollment confirmed on the day that the number of identified students is determined per site

Definitions

- Identified Students Children who are certified for free school meals without the use of a household application
- Enrollment Number of students who are enrolled in and attending schools who have access to at least one meal service daily



Identified Student Data

Two sources of Identified Student Data

There are two ways a student may be classified as categorically eligibility for meal benefits:

- ☐ Through participation in Assistance Programs SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, FDPIR
- Matched at the state level
- ☐ Through Other Source Categorically Eligible status
- Identified on lists provided by local authorized individuals/liaisons



Identified Student Data

Identified students are children who are directly certified for **free** school meals based on their participation (or household member's participation) in other meanstested assistance programs.

Students matched at the state level in Texas ELMS include:

- □ SNAP Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- ☐ TANF Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- □ FDPIR The Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Medicaid Free (Medicaid Reduced students are not included)



^{*}State determined direct certification is extended to all students in the household.

- Checks data
- Loads to Texas ELMS
- Sends file to TEA

- Compares to current attendance
- Adds unique ID and site information

Identified Student Data


Identified students include children who are categorically eligible for free school meals without an application, who are not subject to verification, and who are determined free based on local liaison determination.

Locally determined direct certification lists include:

- ☐ Homeless/Runaway
- Migrant
- □ Foster children
- ☐ Early Headstart
- ☐ Headstart
- Non-applicant students approved by local education officials, such as a principal, based on available information



Timeline for Data Gathering and CEP Reporting






Required Documentation

- ☐ Identified student rosters per site
- Matches CEP Report data

- ☐ PEIMS enrollment confirmation per site
- Matches date identified student rosters are created





Accessing the CEP Report

- Log in to TX-UNPS
- □ Select <u>School Nutrition Programs</u>
- Select <u>Applications</u>
- Select <u>Community Eligibility Provision</u>





Submission

- ☐ TX-UNPS > Applications > Community Eligibility Provision
- Enrollment and Eligibility for Community Eligibility Provision
- Number of Identified Students and Enrollment by site
- Identified Student Percentage and Eligible or Potentially Eligible calculated once data is entered

Due March 20



Sites which have an Identified Student Percentage (ISP) of 40% or greater are eligible for this option.

Sites which have an Identified Student Percentage (ISP) between 30.00% - 39.99% are potentially eligible.

Enter each Site's Number of Identified Students and Enrollment as of the Reporting Date.

Post Submission – CEP Election

TX-UNPS Application Packet Actions

CEP schedule populates when CEP elected



IS roster and enrollment matched to CEP schedule for validation



Validated data determines site claiming percentage
